Month 9: May Diamond star. For each block, cut:

Color 1 (diamond): Two 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch squares

Color 2 (star points and center): Four 3-inch squares, cut in half on the diagonal. One 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch square (this can be a different color for a really scrappy look).

Color 3: (borders pieces): Four 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch rectangles.

Background: Two 3  $^{1\!\!/_2}$  inch squares, and four 2  $^{1\!\!/_2}$  inch squares.

Assembly:

1. Pair the color 1 squares with the two background 3 ½ inch squares. Draw a diagonal line, sew ¼ inch on each side of the line, cut apart and press open. Then cut each half square triangle in half on the diagonal just like the picture.





2. Pair each pieced half square triangle with a color 2 triangle. Be sure the point of the single triangle is on the seam of the pieced triangle. Sew on the diagonal line being careful not to stretch the seam.



3. Press open, then trim to 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches. If you put the 45degree line on your big seam, and make sure the 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ inch mark is on the spot where the two seams meet you can trim a perfect square with no triangle points cut off.



4. Assemble the star points first. Be careful to put the background triangles to the outside edges and the diamond triangles touching each other.



5. Then assemble like a nine-patch.





6. Consider different centers if you want more variety.



7. Add the 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  by 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch borders just like in Month One.



8. Just one month to go. If you have made three each month you will have 30 blocks and be ready to assemble your quilt.
